“Access Add-ins and Code Snippets”

Presenter: Aaron Kogan

This month, Aaron will describe more of the time-saving and dynamic code snippets that he has developed over the years. The "Little Buddies" from his code library are more than worth their weight in gold if you develop Access applications for your clients or for fun. Add-ins allow easy access to tools, created by you or someone else, in virtually all of your database projects. Aaron will be showing some Access add-ins that he has created. It seems that the more we use Access 2007, the more we find new and valuable features.
